

# RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

## 1. NEWSPAPERS, CARDBOARD, MAGAZINES & JUNK MAIL

A. Magazines junk mail (including window envelopes), brown paper bags, and cardboard are accepted.

B. Cardboard from soda cartons, cereal boxes, etc. is also acceptable.

C. Wax-coated materials **ARE NOT** recyclable.

2. **GLASS** jars and bottles only, clear or color, should be rinsed to prevent odor, and rodent problems.

A. Removal of labels and covers is optional

B. Glass, such as light bulbs, window glass, drinking glasses and dishes, mirrors **ARE NOT** recyclable.

3. TIN AND BI-METAL cans should be rinsed to prevent odor and rodent problems.

A. You are **ENCOURAGED** to remove labels.

B. It is helpful to remove both ends of the cans and crush them to save space.

C. **EMPTY** aerosol cans. Remove plastic nozzles & caps and recycle.

D. Large metal items will not be accepted.

4. ALUMINUM cans should be rinsed and crushed to save space.

## 5. PLASTICS

A. Please check the bottom of the item for the recycling symbol and the numbers. Numbers 1 through 7 are acceptable.

B. Plastic bags and styrofoam **ARE NOT** recyclable.

C. Plastic oil containers **ARE NOT** recyclable.

D. It is a **MUST** to rinse residue from plastic containers.

E. Please remove caps from all bottles.

6. LEAD ACID BATTERIES are **NOT** acceptable.

## 7. **COMPUTER EQUIPMENT:**

Computer printers, control processing units (CPUs), computer monitors and keyboards are not recyclable. They can be placed in the refuse cart any time.

**HOW TO HANDLE RECYCLABLE MATERIALS:** Commingle all your recyclables in your yellow lid recycling cart and set it out by 7:00 a.m. on collection day.
